MINT students are invited to obtain graduate credit for their Montessori training through The Institute for Educational Studies (TIES) at Endicott College, an internationally recognized Montessori graduate program. Endicott College is located in Beverly, Massachusetts, just north of Boston.

To earn your M.Ed. requires 36 credits, 19 of which are covered in your training course. In addition to the program outlined by MINT, students complete the following requirements for the graduate degree:

1. Between first and second summers: An online seminar on observation
2. After second summer: A summary paper on what was learned during first and second summers at MINT
3. Between second and third summers: An online seminar on the context for Montessori teaching and learning
4. Course work from September to June after MINT completion

There are no required residencies on the physical campus.

The tuition for the above is \$1950 per semester for five semesters. Enrollment through Endicott College entitles students to apply for Federally Financed Student Loans. To obtain the M.Ed. students need to be jointly enrolled with MINT and Endicott from the beginning of the Montessori training course.
